## Volunteer Positions

The use of a Volunteer Workforce is critical to ensuring the successful and memorable delivery of the 2011 BMW NZ Open Championship.

Volunteers provide support for officials, players, staff and contractors that make up the event workforce.

Volunteer positions cover a wide range of roles, some require golfing knowledge while others just require good "old fashioned" common sense. The majority of positions cover the 4 days of the event, however, positions relative to the Driving Range cover the full week.

Whatever the position, it is important to the success of the 2011 BMW NZ Open Championship.

ROLE	OVERVIEW
Course Marshals	To provide players with the best possible conditions in which to play a shot and the movement around the course without interference
Roving Marshals	To accompany groups attracting larger than normal galleries to ensure that the match is allowed to progress around the course with the minimum of interference
Mobile Scoreboards	To accompany designated groups with a portable scoreboard showing the group of players score status
On Course Leader Boards	To provide players and spectators with progressive scores of the tournament leaders
Main Results Board	To record the scores of each player at the completion of their round
Walker Scorers	To accompany each group to record the player's scores and statistics - at the completion of each hole radio information back to the Media Centre
Caddy Jackets	To issue Caddy Jackets to all caddies and retrieve them at the completion of play



# Volunteer Program

<i>ROLE</i>	<i>OVERVIEW</i>
Media Centre - Base Radio Operator	To communicate with the Walker Scorers on course and input the information into the scoring system
Media Centre - Leader Board Update	To relay the progressive leading player's scores information to the On Course Leader Boards
Media Centre - Scores Input	To enter each player's scoring statistics into the system at the completion on a player's round
Runner Score Service	To deliver copies of the player's score to the Media Centre and Main Results Board
Tee Shuttle Drivers	To provide transport for the players between no 9 green and no 11 tee
Shuttle Drivers	To provide transport for the players between the Clubhouse and the driving range and for the public between the car park and the golf course
Driving Range	To organise the practice range ensuring that an adequate supply of balls is available to players at all times
Water on Tees	To provide water on specific tees for the player's, officials and caddies use
